

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
Sun City Oro Valley | October 2012

As of September 2012 active inventory was 42, a 21% decrease from September 2011. There were 11 closings in September 2012, 57% above September 2011. Months of Inventory was 3.8, down from 7.6 in September 2011. Median price of sold homes was \$200,000 for the month of September 2012, up 14% from September 2011. Sun City Oro Valley had 7 new properties under contract in September 2012, up 133% from September 2011.

Median and Average Price (Closed Sales)








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Months of Inventory by Zip Code








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Months of Inventory Heat Map by Zip Code
