HOUSEHOLD TIPS - WATER CONSERVATION

Living in the Desert Southwest we should always be conscious of conserving water. However, there are plenty of financial incentives to also conserve water and repair leaks. Here are a few common areas to check into to see if you might be the victim of slow leaks.

- Faucets Look for seepage, particularly in areas that aren't used often.
- Hose Bibs All too often hoses don't fit well with the standard hose bib so check for excessive leaking at the connections when in use.
- Irrigation System Run your drip irrigation system periodically and then carefully inspect the property (valves especially). A slow leak that's out of sight could end up a major expense over time.
