



HOUSEHOLD TIPS - TOILET LEAK?

Water leaking from a toilet is not only a drain on the pocket book but can also lead to premature wear of your toilet's internals. To check to see if your toilet might be leaking, simply open the top of the tank and add some red food coloring to the water. Come back an hour later and open the toilet seat to see if the water in the bowl has a pink/red tinge. If it does, then you'll need to replace the flapper in your tank. Replacing this part is a pretty simple DIY project thankfully. Just shut off the water valve into the toilet, take off the tank lid, flush the toilet to drain the water from the tank, and then soak up any excess water as necessary. Disconnect the flush chain from the lever and slide the old flapper up and out over the overflow tube. Replace it with a new flapper, reconnect the lever, and turn the water back on. *Some toilet internals differ slightly
