

The facility offers a variety of opportunities to exercise and be social. Among the offered amenities are



golf, tennis, workout equipment, swimming pools, fitness classes, racquetball courts, and dining options. Residents get preferred pricing for daily use and also on the memberships which are now available. An individual monthly golf membership for a resident costs \$270 while a family is \$392. This also includes a "Premium" Fitness Membership which normally runs \$100/month for a family. A "Classic" Fitness Membership ranges from \$20 for a youth to \$70 for a family.
