HOUSEHOLD TIPS - CLEANING SHOWERHEADS

Over time calcium deposits will build up on your showerheads and either completely restrict the flow of water through some of the spouts or reduce the volume to a drip. One simple way to get rid of these deposits is soaking your showerhead in vinegar. If you can easily remove the showerhead then simply unscrew the head from the stem and soak it in a bowl/bucket of vinegar for at least 30 minutes or up to several hours. *Note: vinegar typically won't damage most finishes, but always test this first* After soaking the showerhead remove it from the vinegar and rinse with water.

Then use an old toothbrush and scrub away any excess residue, before rinsing it once again. If your showerhead isn't easily removable, simply use a large ziploc bag, fill it part way with vinegar & tie string or a rubber band to hold it in place. Then follow the same procedures.
